SGA Bookstore FAQ'S

How will I return my Spring 2020 textbooks that I rented from The SGA Bookstore?

All textbooks rented from the SGA Bookstore can be mailed to the address below when you are done using them for the semester. The return date for renting textbooks is now being extended to June 30, 2020. Students can also return rented textbooks to the store once we re-open for business.

If I bought my book and did not rent it, can I still sell it back?

Yes, you can click on the link below to sell back your non-rented textbook. You can search by ISBN and will give you a printable shipping label if you wish to sell your book. You will receive a check from them within two to three weeks.

Since the commencement is postponed, how do I get my regalia and other commencement items?

Caps and gowns can be purchased through the SGA Bookstore website and will be shipped once the store reopens. The Commencement Office will send all graduates a 2020 tassel and honors cords for those students who graduate with honors.

What does a condensed semester mean for students?

A condensed semester, not an extension, means classes for 12-week courses will still conclude on April 20 and 16-week courses will follow suit on May 4. Final exam week will remain May 5-9.

What does COVID-19 mean for SRU's spring commencement?

SRU's spring commencement ceremonies, scheduled for May 8-9, will be postponed. The move is part of SRU's ongoing effort to stem the spread of the COVID-19 virus. When the national health situation allows it, SRU will recognize spring 2020 graduates, in person, at a time when it is again safe to bring large groups of people together.

How will summer session be affected by COVID-19?

SRU will deliver all summer session classes as it is currently delivering the remainder of the spring semester, via distance modalities. While a majority of our summer session classes are already online, unfortunately, those that are in-person – clinical rotations, student teaching, internships, field experiences, and other types of in-person placements – will be put on hold if they cannot be converted into distance modalities.

COVID-19 Health & Safety Tips Help Stop the Spread of the Coronavirus

1. Wash Your Hands
