# Nonprofit Management Program Updates!

Effective May 16, 2019, SRU's nonprofit management program is housed in the Department of Philanthropy, Nonprofit Leadership, and Public Affairs (PNLPA). Alice Del Vecchio, PNLPA chair, is joined by an additional tenure track faculty member, Daniel Hummel, and Jennifer Bindernagel, an adjunct who is teaching in new department's online degree completion pro-

For the short term, students choosing to pursue a major or minor in nonprofit management will earn a B.S. in Interdisciplinary Program with a concentration in Philanthropy and Nonprofit Management. During 2019-20, the dept faculty will prepare appropriate curricular requests to offer a B.S. in Philanthropy, Nonprofit Leadership, and Public Affairs.

Effective Winter 2019, the prefix for nonprofit focused courses (previously INDP) will become NLPA. There will be no change in course description, content, etc. For winter and spring registration, students interested in B.S. in Interdisciplinary Programs -PNPM concentration should view the new dept and prefix NLPA on banner.

Through the Department of Philanthropy, Nonprofit Leadership, and Public Affairs, Slippery Rock University offers the Commonwealth's only undergraduate academic program in philanthropy and nonprofit management.

Students may select PNLPA as a first or second major or a minor. The required core includes coursework in nonprofit fund raising, budgeting and financial management, program development and evaluation, advocacy and civic engagement, community development, volunteer management and more.

Several SRU academic departments have included PNLPA cour es as requirements within their majors. Others have recommended these courses and the minor to their students.

Students who complete the PNLPA program are prepared to make a contribution to nonprofit organizations immediately follows: lowing graduation. With more than 1.6 million nonprofit organizations currently employing nearly 15% of the US work force, a second major or a minor offers SRU graduates additional employment options.

Since Fall 2017, the nonprofit management program has been available as an online degree completion program for individuals who enroll with a minimum of 60 credits or an Associate's degree. Currently, sixteen students are enrolled. This option expands SRU's ability to enhance the quality of the nonprofit sector well beyond Western Pennsylvania.

In collaboration with other SRU departments, PNLPA offers a variety of Certificates of Achievement which alert potential employers of graduates' specialized skills for the nonprofit sector. Current 15 credit Certificates are listed below. PNLPA seeks the opportunity to partner with other SRU departments to create additional Certificates of Achievement.

SRU is affiliated with the Nonprofit Leadership Alliance (NLA) which offers the nation's only credential for nonprofit professions Certified Nonprofit Professional (CNP)

SRU is one of 36 campuses affiliated with NLA and is the only one located in the northeastern U.S. As an NLA affiliate, the PNLPA program is able to offer all SRU students who complete PNLPA core courses the opportunity to earn the CNP which des ignates that the student has met competencies in 10 areas of nonprofit management. Several national nonprofit organizations dffer additional points in the application process for persons with

# CNP Credential

SRU students completing the PNLPA program are able to earn a national credential through the Nonprofit Leadership Alliance The Certified Nonprofit Professional credential requires candidates show mastery of competencies in ten nonprofit areas through SRU course work, engage in the Student Nonprofit Alliance and attend the Alliance Management Institute. SRU is the only university in northeastern U.S. to offer this credential.

Students interested in earning the credential are required to enroll via the NLA portal. Anyone who plans to work toward the CNP is asked to come to an enrollment event on Wed, Sept 25 at 7:30 pm in 103 Spotts. Those who do not attend this event will not be able to enroll until October 30.

There is a \$25 enrollment fee. Students are urged to bring a credit or debit card to the enrollment event as you cannot enroll until the fee is paid.

There is a \$35 credentialing fee. SNA will pay this fee for students who successfully complete CNP requirements.

PNLPA students graduating before August 2020 should plan to attend the Alliance Management Institute January 5-8, 2020 in Kansas City. Total costs are estimated at \$725 (airfare, hotel, registration fee). Fundraising and SRU support available

A merit system will distribute university and SNA supported funding. This systems will be explained fully at the Sept 25 enrollment meeting. In summary, PNLPA students who are active in SNA, lead projects, serve on the board, attend events and meetings, etc will receive points for their participation. Points will be awarded based on participation and the total funding from SRU and SNA will be distributed to students based on the number of points earned. Do more, earn more!

# Stipend Positions!

SNA has been awarded funds from Butler County to support SPEAK UP! Butler County Youth and We Belong Together.

We are currently recruiting 6 SRU students to manage the SPEAK UP! youth leadership program. SPEAK UP facilitators will work twice monthly with regional high school students to enhance leadership skills, widen youth voice and organize local service projects that improve the community. Facilitators are provided a \$375 stipend at the end of each semester for their work. This team of SRU students will also plan So, You Want to Change the World day, scheduled for April 3, 2020.

We Belong Together supports inclusion and coordinates two oncampus Totally Inclusive Events each year. The team will also assist with building inclusive activities in Cranberry. Two SRU students are needed to join the team led by Chase Sapp. Facilitators are provided a \$375 stipend at the end of each semester for their work.
